
For the next two and a half years Copy's life was idyllic and apart from a few mishaps (such as

way I can describe it is like our subconscious minds get programmed as tracking devices which pick up the smallest deviation in an animal's habits, which would never be noticed unless a close relationship is formed with an animal in a family environment.

When perfect balance is achieved miracles explode all around, but there is not a single formula that sweeps over all animals. It is now possible for Gail, Holly, and myself to pick up an imbalance in an animal within a matter of hours and when these imbalances are small, perhaps 1/2 an hour of extra love and 25cc of more fluids may restore balance to mind and body.

One of the main differences that I have noticed is how Gail will approach treatment of sickness in chronic situations. Instead of focusing on the obvious symptom, she will first balance the animal's mind and emotional state, as we firmly believe that if the mind is imbalanced in any way there is little chance of healing the body, unless you will be satisfied with allopathically suppressing the symptom.

The most difficult to cure and balance is a new animal who is disoriented, scared and has probably been traumatically removed from a long standing routine and environment and inserted into a new situation, generally via a pound or rescue center where the smell of panic and death are unavoidably present. These cases are extreme and time consuming and some times can take up to a year to even find the start of balance. The balancing of an animal can consist of some of the following, however love must always be present. The other elements are diet, homeopathy, animal communication, herbal remedies, flower essences, acupuncture, cranial sacral therapy, social therapy, chiropractic care, traditional Chinese medicine and modern health care. When these are administered to an animal there are only two results, one is that a partial balancing will occur and the health and mentals will improve, and two, a perfect balance will be achieved and 28 year old cats will jump on furniture and play with mice and cancer symptoms will disappear, i.e. a miracle.

I intend to write a whole chapter on this subject in the BrightHaven book, but for now I have run out of time.

THE EVERYDAY WORLD OF BRIGHTHAVEN BY GAIL POPE

hose of you who read the last edition of the Chronicles will remember that "my page" is devoted to acquainting our readers with the history of BrightHaven and describing our everyday world and the people who share it with us.

My last writings described our family journey from England 12 years ago, to the point where we had relocated to Trabuco Canyon and opened our doors and hearts to the waifs and strays of the animal kingdom. To recap a little: I was working hard and learning

lots from Doug Coward DVM and finding the balance of rescued animals gradually leaning towards the elderly, most brought home from work to be saved from euthanasia. We had finally given in to pressure from our friend Vicki Allinson and tentatively begun to feed the animals raw meat.

Things were changing at our house indeed and we were perplexed!! Our younger residents were clearly exuding more good health and energy, but when the senior citizens began to glow, with bright eyes, shiny coats and newfound energy, we had to pay attention. One day we found a 22 year old arthritic little skeleton of a cat, firmly sat upon a chair previously unattainable, and another calmly inspecting the kitchen countertops, previously unknown. Our house was full of cats not only looking, but also behaving 10 years younger!!! We began cautiously adding a few supplements to the diet and were delighted with the results.

Around that time, Vicki introduced me to a well-known authoress and expert in her fields of healthcare and nutrition: Pat McKay. Pat volunteered to try to educate me a little more into the mysterious world of holistic medicine and I was to have my third consult with her one bright sunny day, when I realized that our dear old man "Winston" (featured last BH Chronicles) had developed a huge hematoma in his left ear. His ear was red, throbbing and hugely swollen and so I called Pat, to reschedule, as Winnie must clearly have surgery. Imagine my surprise when Pat, clearly

unperturbed, pronounced that, not only would it be dangerous to put such an elderly dog under anesthetic, but that his problem could be treated with homeopathy. I still knew nothing about homeopathy and the

information Pat gave me did nothing to encourage my belief. How on earth could this work??!! She wanted me to give a remedy which, had it contained any of its original substance, would have caused the same kind of problems that Winnie was experiencing!!! The woman was clearly crazy and I wanted to hang up. Pat suggested that, as Winston's


problem was not life threatening that I should try her suggestions and wait a couple of days before surgery. Hesitantly I agreed and, guess what — Winston never did need surgery!!

I started to devour books on homeopathy, but found the science confusing, baffling and completely contradictory to my everyday world of veterinary medicine. Then, one day came the very push I needed.

I was struggling hard to deal with the impending death of "Cindi" a beloved elderly Persian mix, who had fought Inflammatory Bowel Disease with drugs for so long that they had finally taken their toll and her last hours were clearly approaching. Vicki enlisted the help of Internationally known homeopath Dr. Christina Chambreau (featured last BH Chronicles), who telephoned to offer her help. Politely and tearfully I declined, only to find that Christina was not to be deterred. She firmly informed me that she and not I was the vet, and so I had nothing to lose. I cuddled Cindi and listened and answered many strange questions. What on earth could she do by telephone? - I was miserable, but followed her advice, called Vicki and sent her scurrying to purchase the remedy indicated.

Sometimes we are granted miracles and my experience with Cindi was just such an event, obviously sent to change our lives yet again and forever!! Needless to say Cindi recovered and so began yet another chapter in our ever-changing world...

ver and over again we are asked how we deal with advancing kidney problems in our aging cats.

Some see chronic and acute renal failure as a death sentence and, in our opinion, far too many people panic and take precious time away the minute they hear the news. BrightHaven cares for many cats in various stages of chronic and acute renal failure, many living on HAPPILY for months and often years longer. We understand that the kidneys cannot be regenerated, but there is much to be done.

FIRSTLY IT IS IMPORTANT TO RECOGNIZE THE EARLY WARNING SIGNS:

- Excessive water drinking. (A cat on a nat. diet should not need to drink water)
- Dehydration. (Pick up the fur behind the neck it should SNAP QUICKLY BACK INTO PLACE)
- Finicky eating and sometimes, weight loss
- Dull coat and a general 'dimming' sometimes seen as just 'getting older now' or 'not quite as good as they used to be'.

A blood panel is important at this stage to identify the exact problem and rule out other ailments. The most common illnesses of our seniors are kidney and liver

disease, hyperthyroidism and inflammatory bowel disease: all of which we address with great success.



THE NEXT STEPS:

The single most important thing to be done, in our opinion, is to keep the body properly hydrated, which will flush the kidneys to prevent a build up of toxicity. This is a very simple process (scary at first!) called giving subcutaneous fluids, which involves injecting fluid under the surface of the skin. Your veterinarian will be pleased to demonstrate this procedure for you and advise its frequency. Of course you may take your cat to the vet regularly for treatment, but remember it is important to minimize stress, which is added to greatly by vet visits. We administer SubQ fluids anywhere from once a week, up to two or three times a day, depending upon the need. If your animal is diagnosed as having an acute problem then intravenous

fluids are almost always imperative for just a few days and then once out of danger, a new regime can be found — hopefully with the help of a homeopathic veterinarian. The Bright Haven Way:

- SubQ fluids given with love and in a tranguil environment.
- The natural diet supplemented by "treats" as necessary. (The very sick may have sore or ulcerated mouths or throats and we find a sloppy mix made with baby food or the like

works the best. Please try to aid the kidneys by working with natural treat additives as far as possible).

- Regular consultations with one of our homeopathic veterinarians.
- Herbal preparations. (Animals Apawthecary produce a number of excellent herbal products to aid in kidney, as well as other diseases-available at BrightHaven).
- Flower essences (available from Anaflora).

Other forces to employ to regain balance are: acupuncture, cranial sacral therapy, chiropractic care, magnetic therapy, healing crystals, aromatherapy and traditional Chinese medicine.

The Cat Café proposes to give diet and nutrition tips as well as great recipes, however this first column will be devoted to try and explain the preparation of the natural diet in a simple way. Many people ask us what we feed and as importantly, what we add to it!!

Our basic diet is very simple and comprises meat plus vegetables - fed raw. Your meat source can range from organic or natural to plain old supermarket, depending upon your pocket! Of course, for those of you who are just "too busy to do all that stuff" - you can purchase a diet ready to feed, as I do now. Meat should be ground or chopped to your animal's needs. The vegetables need to be fine ground for digestibility for cats, but larger chunks OK for dogs. When reading about diet suggestions, people get very confused by the wide variety of supplements they are advised to add. Our advice is to keep it as simple as possible, address the animals essential needs, and then add more supplements should you so desire - at a later stage.

Regardless of the diet you choose to feed, knowing what IS essential to add is your next step. These are the guidelines I follow:

- Digestive Enzymes
 - Calcium
- Essential fatty acids
- Nutritional herbs, vitamins and minerals

- Please note that the essential amino acid Taurine is found only in raw meat*
- A great way to give your animals calcium and also a treat is to give them raw chicken necks to chew on.
- Remember it is important to have variety i.e. rotate types of meat and vegetables and don't worry about always adding the appropriate supplements to every meal it is always good to have a change or a rest!!

Vet's Corner

ow many of us take for granted that our own Doctor will send us to the appropriate specialist after diagnosis? — but how many of us actually know of the great specialists available to us in veterinary medicine? Our veterinarian is almost always wonderfully talented and well equipped to take care of our animals and their health problems or emergencies, but just occasionally we need the expertise of someone specializing in soft tissue, oncology, neurology or orthopedics etc. etc. The animal world offers us all these fine options, but the special surgeons who perform this incredible work are rarely known to the general public, as they are normally only available to us upon referral by our veterinarian.

Southwest Surgery and Oncology is one such practice, offering surgical Oncology, chemotherapy, plastic and reconstructive surgery and urogenital work. The practice is both owned and operated by Gayle S. Donner and is available upon referral by your veterinarian. Gayle's credentials include: DVM Diplomat ACVS, 1988; education at University of Georgia, 1981; internship at University of Pennsylvania, 1982; residency at University of Florida, 1987.

Our very first meeting was over a dying cat "Derek". Derek had been horribly injured: his bladder & surrounding areas destroyed. Gingi strong - no sign of his trauma. He is clearly lucky and happy to be alive and now devotes much of his time to working with any one of the animals who is suffering illness. "Gingi" is yet another remarkable case - unable to urinate or defecate on his own after being hit by a car 5 years ago. It became apparent that all was not well when Gingi's appetite went from bad to worse to, unable to eat or even move for pain. Local ultrasounds gave mixed results with no diagnosis apparent. Gingi was clearly going to die unless something miraculous was done. Dr. Donner accepted him as an emergency - took one glance at his x-rays and one more at him and said she would stake her career on the diagnosis. He was rushed straight into surgery where she confirmed that he was suffering a pericardial diaphragmatic hernia and that his liver and spleen were actually wrapped around his heart. Gingi had apparently had this condition since birth and it had been progressively worsening over 7 years and now there was huge tissue damage - a difficult surgery to say the least. Of course "Gingi" recovered to be yet another 'BrightHaven Miracle'.

Gayle is an unbelievably brilliant soft tissue surgeon, who is often only brought into the picture at the possible end of an animal's life. Her dedication is unwavering, and her staff, Board Certified Medical Oncologist Courtney Zwalen, Laura, Kathy, Carrie, and Karen, are all caring and sensitive "animal people."
