

- Here in Santa Rosa we will then aim to maintain our own animal population at a sensible number in order that we are able, to concentrate more heavily on education and also fundraising, which will be greatly required!
- As time goes by Richard and I would also like to try to find a new person to join us here and become my assistant, working closely with Susanna to maintain daily operations and healthcare.

I am advised to dream well and be positive and ambitious and so I am - and I am asking for like minded people to please share their thoughts, and advise us if they have any great notions to help BrightHaven remain as the pilot for this special work.



Born around 1986, Daisy was rescued after her owner could no longer care for her. She is very shy, but adores carrots and will quickly become your friend!!!




Nicki

We are all agreed that Joey is indeed one very lucky little dog!






NEW VOLUNTEER POSITIONS AT BRIGHTHAVEN — AVAILABLE NOW!!

After their presentation there will be time for questions and answers as well as special time reserved for Ann and Kate to take individual appointments.



COMING SOON...BY POPULAR DEMAND


