Here JD is shown proudly with Ollie, who at the tender age of 20 years has decided it is time for him to retire from public speaking engagements.



It was a beautiful May evening and Sam and I were taking our nightly walk with the dogs down to the pond. As we looked further up the tree we noticed that many large colonies had also chosen our beautiful and grand oak for their home.



Luckily, last summer Sam had the opportunity to meet a local bee keeper who has been making honey in our neck of the woods for donkey’s years and, after contacting him we learned that our new bees were a little “pot of gold” to him and so he hurried to BrightHaven to relocate them to his own little bee paradise. I am delighted to report that we are still receiving bookings for this year and would just like to remind you that we offer


“Bed and Breakfast – with a difference” here at BrightHaven!!

Sam has a natural talent with animals and his daily responsibilities are primarily medical and range from the preparation and delivery of remedies homeopathic or herbal, to the daily administration of life saving subcutaneous fluid therapy.

Sam has recently worked on several BrightHaven event booths with Suzy and found himself taking to it like a duck to water - which leads me to mention that he is also in charge of the BrightHaven birds and is totally adored by his chicken girls, not to mention the geese and ducks of course!



Unfortunately we can only afford to have Sam working with us part time but visitors to BrightHaven will often find this personable young man devoting his afternoon to helping Richard out with the weekend tasks – such as mowing the huge areas of grass – rebuilding fences and mending all manner of things!

4 VOLUNTEER NEWS

CHRISTY Johnson has been a long time friend of BrightHaven and dedicates all her spare time to coming to volunteer help with the animals. Christy is a huge star with the BrightHaven dogs and is always forced to take them for a stroll before beginning her tasks for the day!

Christy joined us at BrightHaven for Kathleen Prasad's beginning Reiki class and loved it sooo much that she has already taken level 2 Reiki and is actually starting her own business very soon, which will incorporate Reiki skills with her many other talents in the care of animals – such as elderly animal care at home – especially at the end of life, the use of flower essence therapy and much more Her new company is to be called “A Peaceful Journey for Animals” and we know she will be a huge success.

Christy has recently traveled her own long road with her own elderly feline – Ronnie, who has been preparing to make his transition for some months and she has now written her delightful and very poignant story of their journey together. Reading it brought tears to my eyes as I realized what joy and peace it conveys. I strongly urge you to read on.....

Riding the Reiki Wave By Christy Johnston

As I start to write this on March 29th, my kitty, who was resting under my desk on a soft blanket in his bed, emerges, taking in a long drawn-out breath and giving a restricted cough. He is 14 and has a mass growing in his neck, which is now constricting his breathing. He will pass peacefully, I am confident, with the help of Reiki.

At the beginning of March, Kathleen came to BrightHaven, a healing arts center for animals where I am a volunteer, to teach a group of us the ancient technique of Reiki. We practiced on people one day, on animals the next, and took all the initiations to be certified as Level 1 practitioners. I didn't know it then, but I would be using Reiki at least 2 times a day to help Ronnie with his health and healing.

Ronnie has been with me for 12 years. He has been the gentle leader of my kitty family of five, over the years raising a couple from kittenhood as their mother and father, accepting two more in off the streets, and generally teaching them all, in his wisdom, how to live more fully and joyfully. A friend visited him yesterday and noticed how they all took his lead in divine greeting with a bow of the head to her hand.



Of course there is always hope of a cure with any healing modality so, four days after my Reiki class ended, I started focusing my practice on Ronnie, almost convincing myself that I was not expecting a cure. Kathleen joined the team shortly thereafter, doing four ½ hour long-distance sessions with him on consecutive days, and continuing with a regular session long distance every three days. I am getting used to the regimen now but it has been nice to get a respite every third night and to hear about Kathleen's experiences with Ronnie's sessions that she emails me the next day.

I offered Reiki to my kitties starting March 3rd and switched to Ronnie twice a day on the 6th. Kathleen started her four session treatments on the 8th. Ronnie hit a low period where he became weak, dehydrated, and wouldn't eat from March 5th through the 10th. He then improved greatly, eating again and with interest. I am wondering if he had a healing crisis because of the Reiki or if the Reiki took him out of the downward spiral. Whichever, it was great to see him enjoying life again.

Kathleen taught us that Reiki will go where it is needed but it is still mysterious to me. Ronnie's breathing had become labored and erratic before we started Reiki. He looked uncomfortable. Since starting Reiki, the tumor has not shrunk, but his breathing is calm and full. I'm just amazed at how this would work and so happy for him that he can rest more peacefully again. One day, I had to limit both the nighttime and the next morning's treatments to 15 minutes. I noticed right away that his breathing became a little more labored. So I feel comfortable that the two ½ hour sessions that he receives every day are keeping a good balance and that this can be upped if needed.

On April 10th, my sister came to give him lunch while I was away and she left me a note: "Still so powerful and still inside". More and more, Ronnie doesn't notice his illness, though the tumor continues to grow. Now, at the end of April, I have seen him make adjustments, time and again, so that he can find enjoyment in the day. He takes it slower going up and down the stairs. And rather than taking a couple bites and walking off to catch his breath, he now stays at his plate to catch his breath and then continues eating. It's as if, in allowing Reiki to bring its peace inside, Ronnie can operate more peacefully and willingly in the outside world.

On April 12th, Ronnie came into the bedroom in the middle of the night. He was having a little trouble breathing. I offered him Reiki for ½ hour and his breathing settled and he went back to sleep. That morning there were no signs of labored breathing and I continued the twice a day treatments. I was grateful that he sought me out for help that he sought out Reiki.

The majority of Ronnie's treatments have been from a few feet away. He may be walking around the room when I start, but a few minutes into the treatment, he is on his bed, resting with eyes partly closed or sleeping. A very few times, he has come and lay in front of me and I have put my hands near him or on his sides for a very few minutes until he walks away. Luckily, I often do Reiki sitting on the floor so that hands-on or hands-near can be an option.

Toward the end of April, I was encouraged by what Kathleen was feeling from her treatments to start offering Reiki to the family, to prepare us to carry on when Ronnie was gone. In doing so, I saw relationships tighten and kitties who had not played together before start interacting and touching noses. That was an important piece for us and for Ronnie, who would want to make sure the family was going to be okay before he left.

Around the beginning of April, Ronnie started to be less aware, at times, of what was going on around him. Now, at the end of April, he is often crouched and looking contemplative. I feel that Reiki aids him and his spirit in connecting with the place where he will go after death of the physical body.

Ronnie has given me a great gift. He has encouraged me, through his illness, to practice a very effective technique and to see that there is something I can do for him when it feels like there is nothing I can do to help him. With Ronnie's body slowly winding down, I am accepting his eventual passing, in part, because I have had time with him and been able to aid in his journey. I am grateful for the comfort he has gotten from Reiki and I'm encouraged that I will be seeing him ride the Reiki wave, without looking back, to the other side.

Daisy, our most beautiful, but very pushy palomino immediately came over to investigate the situation. She leaned her head down to examine what I had in my "pouch", and what happened next left me in true awe, as I realized I was experiencing yet another BrightHaven miracle.



Daisy gently placed her muzzle on Alfie's head and began to slowly breathe very deeply as she gently explored her way around his entire tiny, sleeping body. She half closed her eyes and seemed to fall into a very focused, almost meditative state. Her ears began to travel backward and forward in a gentle rocking motion that mimicked her breathing pattern. I soon realized that Alfie was also breathing in this same pattern and that the erratic breathing that had troubled him all morning, was no longer evident.

This beautiful moment seemed to last forever and both the tour ladies and I were moved to tears by the tenderness shared between our dominant and spirited horse and our dear little dog.


